

- Using:
- Paper Surveys
  - **Online Surveys**
  - Traditional: 1, 2, 3 times per year
  - Pulse: monthly, bi-weekly, weekly, daily, etc.

## Why We Assess

To fill gaps in what decision makers can know using standard academic assessments, in order to improve learning experiences and environments, to improve social, emotional, and academic outcomes.

## The Role of Research

- To measure the validity and reliability of each metric in the system
- To understand the system of correlational and causal relationships connecting the various concepts measured
- To determine the most effective reporting and support systems for optimizing the usefulness of reported measures for improving teaching and learning

# Sample Student DEI Items

- At this school, everyone tries hard to understand people from different backgrounds.

  - how often have students you know treated you with less respect than other students?
  - How often have you shared personal feelings or had an honest discussion outside of class with students whose families come from a different country or culture than your family?

# Sample Faculty and Staff DEI Items


- This year at school, how often have you
  - Connected the things you teach in class to problems or issues in the world?
  - Taught your students about famous people from many different cultures?
- What additional support in implementing an inclusive curriculum would be helpful?
- How strongly do you agree with the following statements?
  - We have discussed the way equity issues impact our school.
  - We have explicit goals related to making our school more inclusive.

# Sample Family DEI Items

- How true are the following statements about this school?

  - Taught your child about famous people from many different cultures
















