Space and Environment I Classroom Design





Move the teacher's desk to the side (or remove it altogether).

Select or create seating options that are flexible/moveable Ask students to help design different class configurations for different purposes, and create "reset" options.

Create moveable writable spaces (whiteboards, wallspace, clipboards etc)



Relationships I Check-Ins with Students

Purpose of Check-Ins for Teachers

- Quickly and easily pose a question and use the information students share to inform decisions to stay the course or adjust in order to meet their needs
- Leveraging a number system where students use their fingers to communicate or strategies like four-corners are considerations when wanting to create the time and space, and also needing to stay on track with the learning objectives for that day

Check-Ins should...

- Engage students right from the start
- Increase a sense of belonging
- Deepen connections

Check-Ins should not...

- Require students to share information they are not comfortable sharing
- Maximize the instructional time and goals for the class period



Norms and Values I Creating them Together

- 1. **Brainstorm:** Have students discuss what does their ideal learning community look and sound like ?
- 2. **Get specific:** what does it mean to be collaborative? How might that look and feel?
- 3. **Revisit often:** start each day or class by reinforcing norms and values.
